For Master's programs only, COAMFTE has established a benchmark of 70% licensure rate for each cohort.

Contextual information:

^ 44% of the 9 admitted students graduated in the minimum-3 year advertised time due to medical issues, loss of employment, and delay in accruing required clinical client contact hours. However, a total of 8 students (89%) of this class went on to complete and graduate from the program within the Maximum Advertised Time

~ The 2019-2020 class year's completion rate in the Minimum Advertised was severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Some students were forced to stop attending due to family responsibilities and circumstances. However, with additional time, 88% have gone on to graduate with additional time needed to complete their degree.

+ 50% graduated in the Advertised time, however with additional time, 83% went on to graduate and complete their degree.
